- May 7 Joyful Noise Sunday! Holy Communion. On this Fourth Sunday in Eastertide, we will celebrate the power of music in our spiritual lives. Four Chancel Choir members will give witness to how music impacts their relationship with God. Scripture reading is John 10:1-11.
- May 14 Sermon Series on our Mission Statement begins. Pastor Anne invites us to consider the opening words of our new Mission Statement, as we explore what it might mean to be a "demonstration plot" tended by the Master Gardener. This Fifth Sunday in Eastertide, Jesus' teachings about his being "the way, the truth and the life" will guide us (John 14:1-14).
- May 21 Celebration of Graduates and Faith Formation Program. We celebrate our graduates and also our First Hour faith formation leaders on this Sixth Sunday in Eastertide. Continuing the Sermon Series on our Mission Statement, Pastor Anne explores how the unconditional welcome we offer is made possible by our inner transformation. Jesus' teaching about the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, from John 14:15-21, guides our reflections. A Salad-Bar Potluck, in celebration of graduates and First Hour programming, will follow worship. Bring salad items or dessert to share.
- May 28 Sermon Series on our Mission Statement concludes. The closing strategies of our Mission Statement describe how our sharing of God's restorative power is made possible. First, we ourselves need to grow spiritually, through our own learning and participation in worship. The story of Jesus' "ascension," from Luke 24:44-53, guides our understanding of this connection.

# From your Interim Pastor

The Rev. Anne Swallow Gillis

For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:38-39)

These words from the Apostle Paul are helping to ground me, during this sad and tender week of fellow members', Bob and Jeanie Morrison, auto accident in Europe. In learning of Bob's death and Jeanie's severe injuries, I have been reminded of both the fragility and the preciousness of life. As many of us have gathered together this week, for choir rehearsal and various meetings, work on the property, phone calls, email messages, poignant conversations and prayer, I have been uplifted by the Body of Christ that is Falcon Heights Church. In this terribly disorienting time, we are experiencing several realities: life is never "safe" and there is a true and deep "safety" in God's presence and in the company of followers of Jesus.

During our Sunday worship "children's time" recently, I talked with the kids about how much I appreciate change and also how much I resist it. We laughed together as I shared how my sweet husband has already begun to pack-up our apartment in St. Paul, in anticipation of my retirement and our move to Grand Marais. "Where are the kitchen towels?" I exclaimed last week, as I discovered yet another kitchen drawer dismantled and packed-away. Ending my 38 years of ordained ministry and moving to another community are challenging, yet they are predictable and manageable changes. It's the changes that appear out of nowhere, that come with an unexpected phone call on a Tuesday afternoon when we least expect it, that are so difficult. And we may wonder where God is in all of this wrenching news and unfolding disruption in our lives.

More than ever, I sense God is in the midst of all of it. God doesn't cause me to retire, move and leave all of you good people. Nor does God cause auto accidents, nor other unexpected suffering in our lives. "Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, you are with me," wrote the Psalmist. As I have been reading Richard Rohr's book, *The Divine Dance*, in preparation for our May study group, my images of God's pervasive, infusing and enlivening presence has expanded. I'm struck by how vulnerable we make ourselves when we risk relationships: with God and with each other. We risk being known, we risk losing one another, we risk learning about God's deepest hopes for our lives. Opening our hearts to God and one another is never safe....but I would not want to live in any other way.

# Moderator Update by Lynne Bradbury

At the January 29th Annual Congregational Meeting the new Mission Statement was presented along with Priorities for 2017. The priorities were established to help guide our use of resources and reflect on our role as "Seekers and Servants Growing in God's Transforming Love." Congregation members and friends signed up on circulating clipboards to be part of the idea process.

The following are the Priorities for 2017 with their corresponding lay leader "Conveners."

- 1. **Public gatherings that address social justice issues** from a progressive Christian faith perspective (Conee Biggs, Linda Owen).
- 2. Expand and strengthen Wednesday night programming (Kyle Roeckeman, Lynne Bradbury)
- 3. Expand and strengthen our **Sunday morning experience** (Bryan Seyfarth and Peter Duddleston)

On a Saturday morning in the middle of February, Pastor Anne led the group of "Conveners" in a training of sorts to prayerfully consider the Mission Statement and work through a creative process A heartfelt thank you to Pastor Anne for her time and effort toward this process. It was exciting to see the walls lined with colorful post-its that identified the resources and community connections of Falcon Heights Church.

The very next Saturday morning, God's Spirit could be felt moving throughout the church building as the three priority groups met separately to consider "How To" put the Priorities in motion. Many thanks to the participants and conveners! Your willingness to participate and contributions of ideas were invaluable.

Most of the Priority Groups met a second time to organize their ideas into recommendations for the Executive Board. At the April, Executive Board Meeting, the conveners presented their recommendations. The following are the measurable goals to move the Priorities and thus the Mission Statement forward.

Priority 1: LGBTQ follow-up actions and build connections with the Muslim community. Conee and Linda will act on behalf of the Executive Board to communicate and collaborate on this goal with the Outreach Ministry Team.

Priority 2: Hold three session of Wednesday night suppers with programming throughout the year. One has already happened this Spring. Lynne and Kyle will communicate with ministry teams and staff about the programming.

Priority 3: Coordinate a review of the Interim period for the Sunday Morning experience. Bryan and Peter will meet with Pastor Anne, Music Staff- Joel and Karen Johnson to choose priorities for the rest of 2017.

# The Mission Statement, approved by the EB on September 20, 2016:

Falcon Heights Church, United Church of Christ, seeks to become a demonstration plot for the reign of God on earth, sowing seeds of love, peace and justice, and cultivating the transformative possibilities revealed in Jesus Christ, the Master Gardener. We will (our strategy):

- 1. Offer unconditional welcome, sanctuary and spiritual nourishment to everyone hungry for God's love.
- 2. Tend to our inner transformation through prayer, the exploration of scripture, kindness, forgiveness, and openness to God's still-speaking voice.
- 3. Share God's restorative power to repair injustice within our wider community through witness and service.
- 4. Teach about our faith and inspire deeper connections with God through vibrant worship and a wide spectrum of music and the creative arts.

## **AUDIT COMMITTEE**

On April 8, 2017 we conducted an initial review of the FHUCC financial records. Members of FHUCC present were Dave Hill (Treasurer), Pete Duddleston (ex officio Audit committee) & Bob Morrison (audit committee). Libby O'Connell (Audit committee) was unable to attend.

- 1. We reviewed statements for two checking accounts for January and February, 2017.
- 2. We compared key measures in the Jan 31, 2017 Statement of Financial Position with the checking accounts.
- 3. We reviewed checks reported as issued for Jan & Feb with the checking account.
- 4. We discussed selected transactions.

#### Conclusions:

- 1. The books being kept are up to date, clear and concise.
- 2. Checking account balances were identical to those on the financial statement.
- 3. No unexpected issues were detected.
- 4. Several transactions involving the fire monitoring system were discussed and Peter will inquire with Property & Maintenance committee for details.
- 5. The audit committee will meet again at end of Q2 to review records. Going forward, the committee will add "random" investigations to the auditing process.

We mourn the sudden death of Robert (Bob) Morrison, who died in an auto accident outside of Prague, Czechoslovakia on May 2. An internationally known veterinary specialist in the area of swine production and professor of veterinary medicine at the University of Minnesota, Bob was traveling with his wife Jeanie, and several other colleagues and their spouses, to a veterinary conference. Jeanie sustained critical injuries and is currently at a military hospital outside of Prague. Memorial service arrangements are pending for Bob. We keep Jeanie, their children Jessie, Peter and Will, as well as extended family and friends, in our prayers.

**Faith L. Ohman** died on April 8, 2017 at Episcopal Church Home in St. Paul. A long-time resident of Falcon Heights and member of our church, Faith was one of the early women attorneys in the state of Minnesota, having graduated from Macalester College and the University of Minnesota Law School. She was active in our Women's Fellowship for many years.
